

Passage 1

Why is setting goals important? Because goals can help you do, be, and experience everything you want in life. Instead of just letting life happen to you, goals allow you to make your life happen.

Successful and happy people have a vision of how their life should be and they set lots of goals (both short-term and long-range) to help them reach their vision. By setting goals you are taking control of your life. It's like having a map to show you where you want to go. Think of it this way. There are two drivers. One has a destination in mind (her goal) which is laid out for her on a map. She can drive straight there without any wasted time or wrong turns. The other driver has no goal or destination or map. She starts off at the same time from the same place as the first driver, but she drives aimlessly around, never getting anywhere, just using up gas and oil. Which driver do you want to be?

Winners in life set goals and follow through on them. Winners decide what they want in life and then get there by making plans and setting goals. Unsuccessful people just let life happen by accident. Goals aren't difficult to set – and they aren't difficult to reach. It's up to you to find out what your goals, ideals and visions really are. You are the one who must decide what to pursue and in what direction to aim your life.



Research tells us that when we write a goal down we are more likely to achieve it. Written goals can be reviewed regularly, and have more power. Like a contract with yourself, they are harder to neglect or forget. Also when you write your goals in a particular fashion you are able to stimulate your subconscious to be continuously alert to situations that will further your goal.

Passage2

The typical conversation between Americans takes a form that can be called repartee. No one speaks for very long. Speakers take turns frequently, often after only a few sentences have been spoken. "Watching a conversation between two Americans is like watching a table tennis game," a British observer said. "Your head goes back and forth so fast it almost makes your neck hurt."

Americans tend to be impatient with people who take long turns. Such people are said to "talk too much." Many Americans have difficulty paying attention to someone who speaks more than a few sentences at a time, as Nigerians, Arabs, and some others do. Americans admire conciseness, or what they call "getting to the point."

Americans engage in little ritual interaction. Only a few ritual greetings are common, "How are you?" "I'm fine, thank you," "Nice to meet you," and "Hope to see you again." These things are said in certain situations Americans learn to recognize, and, like any ritual greetings, are concerned more with form than with substance. That is, the questions are supposed to be asked and the statements are supposed to be made in particular situations, no matter what the people involved are feeling or what they really have in mind. In many Americans' opinions, people who rely heavily on ritual greetings are "too shy" or "too polite," unwilling to reveal their true natures and ideas.

Americans are generally impatient with long ritual greetings about family members' health – common among Latin Americans – considering them a waste of time.

Passage 3

The number of actual words in English is relatively quite small. There are some half a million words recorded in the Oxford English Dictionary, and a similar number in Webster's Third New International Dictionary. However, the two books do not contain exactly the same words – many British dialect words do not appear in the US book (Webster's) and vice versa. There is as yet no "super dictionary" which includes all the words in English, including all dialect, slang, and specialized words. And when we consider how English is spreading around the world and borrowing thousands of words from other languages in such places as India, South Africa and Malaysia, it is obvious that keeping up with the vocabulary of the language is an immense task. So nobody knows exactly how many words there are in English, although there are at least a million.

The only real limiting factor on the growth of a language's vocabulary is the power of the human imagination. People invent words all the time, although not all of them actually get into the standard language. A few years ago, on a BBC Radio 4 program, there was a competition in which listeners were asked to invent words to express concepts of importance to them. The winner was the word we need to express the feeling we have when we are at an airport waiting for our luggage to appear on the carousel, and everyone else's luggage is appearing except ours: it was "bagonize".
